Grammar Exercises: gap-fill, multiple choice, error correction, writing sentences from prompts, rewriting sentences

Focus

Defining relative clauses with who, which, where and when

Aim

To practice defining relative clauses with who, which, where and when.

Preparation

Make one copy of the two-page worksheet for each student.

Level

Intermediate (B1)

Time

30 minutes

Introduction

This relative clauses worksheet helps students to practice defining relative clauses with who, which, where and when.

Procedure

Give each student a copy of the two-page worksheet.

Students begin with a gap-fill exercise where they complete sentences by choosing the correct relative pronouns.

Exercise A - Answer key

Next, students rewrite sentences, correcting the relative pronoun mistake in each one.

Exercise B - Answer key

After that, students write definitions for places, things, times and people using defining relative clauses, e.g. 'A kitchen is a room where people store and cook food.'

When the students have finished, check their definitions together as a class.

Lastly, students rewrite sentences, combining them together using defining relative clauses.
